"62 Days" is a documentary by filmmaker Rebecca Haimowitz that depicts the well-known Texan case of Marlise Muñoz and the painful distress her family went through when forced to keep her deceased body on mechanical support because she was pregnant. The film raises important questions about the removal of mechanical support from pregnant women—whether deceased or still living. Although Texas' law was quite far-reaching, there are currently 32 states with similar pregnancy exclusion policies that bar pregnant women's decisions over their own bodies.
